<u>Dr. Greg Hoover</u> - Cicada - The Big Eastern Brood Thursday, December 3rd at 7:30pm via Zoom

Brood X of the periodical cicada (known as the "Big Eastern Brood") will emerge next year in Pennsylvania counties that comprise the southeastern and south central 2/3's of our state. After their 17-year underground existence, nymphs will provision their escape routes from the soil during mid- to late May. Adults will emerge and be active from late May through early July in many states in the eastern United States. Learn about the natural history, biology, and folk lore associated with these insects. If you like to fly fish, Greg will discuss tying an effective pattern to imitate the adult stage of these insects and will make suggestions for fly fishing during this true wonder of nature. The Early Years

The Spring Creek Chapter of Trout Unlimited (SCCTU) was founded in 1973, and one of its first projects was to organize a stream cleanup. These annual cleanups have continued until the present and are now organized by ClearWater Conservancy. The Chapter's first stream restoration project involved stream bank repair and trout habitat improvement on Spring Creek in the vicinity of Neidigh Quarry (now Hanson Quarry) upstream of Lemont.
