Ben Hayes: Landscape Memory: A Natural History of Some of our Local Waters Thursday, March 3rd at 7:30pm via Zoom

The watersheds of central Pennsylvania have a fascinating geologic and anthropogenic history that is relevant to fly fishers today. Learn how streams "remember" events in their past and how the fingerprints of these events can be detected on the landscape. Awareness of these memories will enrich your fly fishing experience and help you determine what stream restoration approaches will be the most effective in the future.

Ben is a professor of Watershed Sciences and Engineering at Bucknell University, specializing in fluvial geomorphology and stream restoration. A member of the R.B. Winter chapter of TU, he loves tying flies and fishing streams near his home in Mifflinburg, PA.

Trout in the Classroom Update

The SCCTU-sponsored Trout in the Classroom (TIC) program, on hiatus since 2020 is scheduled to back in operation by February 2nd. The TIC is an environmental education program in which students in grades k-12 learn about the care and protection of cold-water fisheries by raise trout from eggs to fry. Most programs end the year by releasing their trout in a state-approved stream near the school or within a nearby watershed.

The Spring Creek Watershed Atlas

Title: Monitoring Efforts in the Watershed: Water Resources Monitoring Project **Author:** Lexi Orr

The Spring Creek Water Resources Monitoring Project (WRMP) is conducted in partnership with the Keystone Water Resources Center, a publicly-funded, non-profit organization dedicated to collecting data on the water resources of Pennsylvania. The mission of the WRMP is to collect scientifically useful water quality and quantity data and make those data available to the public and to educate the public on surface and groundwater resources, with a focus on the Spring Creek Watershed. The WRMP, initiated in 1998 under the auspices of the Spring Creek Watershed Association, was organized by residents interested in the conservation of the watershed. Until 2019, the project was housed and fiscally managed at ClearWater Conservancy. The WRMP maintains a database of stream level, temperature, water quality and groundwater level data, which is annually published in a report and is publicly available upon request. Data requests can also be made directly to the project office: lexie@keystonewaterresources.org or through the website.
